

**FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS
CALL FOR PROPOSAL
GERAK INSAN GEMILANG (GIG)**

1. WHAT IS THE IMPORTANCE OF INTRODUCING AND IMPLEMENTING THE *GERAK INSAN GEMILANG (GIG)* PROGRAMME?

Gerak Insan Gemilang (GIG) is aimed at facilitating Malaysians especially the youths with specific skills and knowledge through end-to-end training which enable them to become freelancers for better income.

2. WHO ARE ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE IN THIS PROGRAMME?

The target group of GIG programme is Malaysians who are looking to upgrade their skills and knowledge through training programmes which enable them to become freelancers upon completion of the training.

3. WHO ARE REQUIRED TO SUBMIT THE PROPOSAL FOR GIG PROGRAMME?

The proposal should be submitted by the HRDF registered training providers.

4. WHEN IS THE DATE OF PROPOSAL SUBMISSION?

The proposals can be submitted from 18th June to 17th July 2020. The date for future submissions will be notified after 17th July 2020 (if any).

5. ARE THERE ANY CHARGES IMPOSED FOR THE PROPOSAL SUBMISSION?

HRDF will not be imposing any charges for the proposal submission.

6. HOW LONG DOES IT TAKE TO GET THE FEEDBACK OR RESULT UPON SUBMITTING THE PROPOSAL?

It takes up to 15 working days from the submission date till the notification is sent to the training providers. However, it is subject to the complete submission of documentation required and adhering to the provided Proposal Format.

7. CAN TRAINING PROVIDERS PROPOSE TO HAVE A BLENDED TRAINING METHOD?

Yes, training providers are allowed to conduct blended training delivery method (f2f classroom and self-paced training). Apart from that, the training can be conducted either in full time or part time mode. All this information need to be enlightened during the proposal submission stage.

8. ARE THE TRAINING PROVIDERS REQUIRED TO SUBMIT THE HARDCOPY OF PROPOSAL TO HRDF?

All information / documents (Part 1 – Part 4) as mentioned in the proposal format are required to be uploaded as an attachment through the online proposal submission via HRDF portal. If you are required to submit the hardcopy of proposals due to technical issues, you may submit it to Strategic Initiatives Department.

9. HOW MUCH IS THE FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FOR THIS PROGRAMME?

HRDF will provide the financial assistance of up to RM5,000 for the course fee including other allowances with proper justification based on the cost breakdown. The allowed course fee does not include certification costs. If the nature of the course is certification, an increase in the fees can be considered during the proposal stage.
