# HRD CORP & MICROSOFT TO TRAIN AND PLACE 300,000 MALAYSIAN DIGITAL PROFESSIONALS IN THREE YEARS UNDER NEW PARTNERSHIP

*Initiative aims to produce global-ready local talents under the Bersama Malaysia initiative*

**Kuala Lumpur, 5 May 2021** – The Human Resource Development Corporation (HRD Corp) and Microsoft Malaysia will be driving the training and development efforts for 300,000 Malaysian professionals in the next three years. This will be done to support the growth of the nation's digital-ready workforce.

HRD Corp will focus on developing and facilitating training and certification programmes through its comprehensive network and platform, as well as identifying, attracting and securing the right trainees.

According to the Honourable Minister of Human Resources, Datuk Seri M Saravanan, "We are pleased to support Microsoft and the government's national digital transformation efforts by skilling the right digital talents for the various industry and business needs. This public-private partnership featuring Microsoft, MAMPU, HRD Corp and other leading local private sector players will be the game-changer in the way we develop our people and subsequently, our economy. This is also a great opportunity for Malaysians to embrace new skills development opportunities that will make them more employable and valuable in the long term."

Commenting on the partnership, K. The Human Resource Development Corporation (HRD Corp) was established in 1993 as the Human Resources Development Council (HRDC). As an agency under the Ministry of Human Resources, it was responsible for the collection of levies from key industries and the disbursement of training grants through its internal mechanics known as the Human Resources Development Fund (HRDF).

In 2001, HRDC was incorporated via the Pembangunan Sumber Manusia Berhad Act 2001 (PSMB Act 2001), and became Pembangunan Sumber Manusia Berhad (PSMB). The transformation enabled the organisation to serve a broader range of industries while creating a robust training and development ecosystem for talents and providers.

In April 2021, HRDF became HRD Corp. The name change is a reflection of its new responsibilities, directions and mission; ensuring that all Malaysians are adequately trained, and highly employable.
